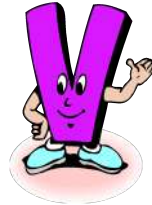

Social Media



With the NZ Government announcing plans for the '**Online Safety** (minimum age and Child Safety Risk Assessment) **Bill** to ban users under 16 from high-risk social media platforms, it is a timely reminder for you to closely monitor what (if any) social media platforms your child(ren) is/are into.

As a start, the above social media platforms have a self-imposed age limit of 13.

As educators, we regularly become aware of the harmful impacts of social media on young people. In the worst cases, distractions to learning; sleep deprivation; exposure to threats, hate, harassment and discrimination aka cyberbullying and related impacts of anxiety and depression; social isolation, mental health deterioration and exposure to online predators.

We strongly recommend that you actively:

- Monitor your child's digital/online activity
- Have regular talks about social media
- Discuss the dangers of online activity, 'stranger danger' & anonymous accounts
- Encourage more face-to-face contact with friends
- Monitor your child's interactions with A.I



Other lesser known platforms we are concerned about include 'Reddit' ,



'Roblox' and 'Five Nights with Freddy'.



The latter was randomly described to me today by a 7 year old as "it's got bad and scary stuff" and "it has horror". Interesting! My point exactly!

Calf and Pet Day 2026

Wednesday 21 October 2026

A wonderful day to celebrate the bond between children and their animals, creativity, community and country life at our school.



WHAT YOU NEED TO KNOW



Calves, lambs and kids

- These pets need to be born between 20th July - 25th September.
- Children are expected to present their pets to the judges in a "well cared for" condition.
- They will lead and call their pet and talk to the judges about how they have cared for them.
- Parents can also transport these pets to school with a lead and drinking water.
- Pets are tethered to the fence alongside the field, and children are expected to stay with their pet.
- Adults are not allowed with children and pets while judging is taking place however, there are stewards who will help your child with their pet.
- When the child hands in their pet day form, they will be given a booklet for calves and lambs only that covers this in more detail.
- This year, due to TB restrictions, we have consulted with local vets and will be taking precautions by keeping all calves separate to minimize any risk.



Get Creative Competition

This is a "Mythological Creatures" themed creativity competition. Children can enter a creation made at home which fits into any of these three categories:

- **Edible creations**, e.g. cupcake creations, vegetable creations.
- **Arts and crafts**, e.g. recycled creations, knitted craft, fabrics.
- **Digital art**, e.g. stop motion animation, photography, video/movies, programming.

Pet Parade

- Dress up yourself and your pet any way you like.
- There is no theme for this.
- Everyone will walk in procession showing off their beautifully dressed pets.
- Prizes will be awarded.



Dogs

- Dogs need to have a nice nature to attend Calf and Pet Day.
- Dogs need to be tethered on grass in front of the main block of classrooms.
- Children are expected to lead and call their dog and talk to the judges about how they care for them.



Domestic pets

- Your domestic pet needs to be contained in an enclosure, which will be kept in a classroom.
- Your child is expected to stay with their pet and talk to the judges while they are tending for them.
- These pets need to be brought to school by parents/caregivers.

Preschoolers

- We welcome preschoolers to bring along a pet.
- There will be a special ring for calves and lambs only on the field, which they can walk around with their pet.
- They are allowed parental help.

Whānau Entertainment

- Pet Day is a great day out for families.
- Come and watch the children in the competition rings.
- Stroll through the creative entries, buy raffle tickets, and enjoy baking, BBQ, coffee, and cold drinks in the spring sunshine.

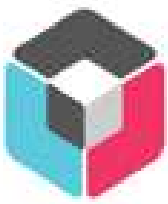

Variable and Static Speed Signs

To help keep children safe on their way to and from school, new variable speed limits on our current electronic variable speed signs will be introduced on roads near school entrances from June 2026. New static road signs/boards will also be installed.

Outside Broadlands School, the variable speed will be **reduced** to **30 km/h** (from the current 40 km/h).

The electronic variable speed times have also been increased to an hour at each end of the day, being **8:00 – 9:00am** and **2:45 – 3:45pm** respectively.

★ if a child is taking a bus different from their usual bus or

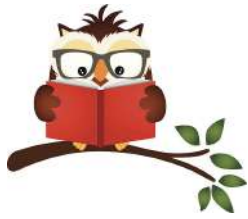
★ if they won't be on the bus that day due to getting collected from school or

Reading together helps to promote the development of early literacy skills including:



- Knowledge of the alphabet
 - Turning pages
- Pointing/sweeping of the finger
 - Text orientation (left to right)
- Developing word knowledge/vocabulary
- Recognising punctuation and grammatical features
- Phonological awareness- the sounds that letters and letter blends make
 - Improving comprehension
 - Building independence
 - Creating social awareness
- Developing perceptions and emotions in life.



The quantity and quality of your shared reading experience will impact greatly on your child's reading success!

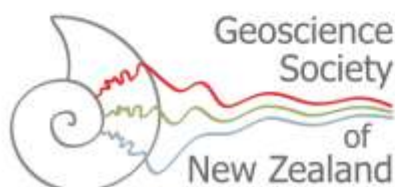
EarthFest – A Festival of Earth Science 2026
