<u>Alert Level 1</u>

In anticipation of a NZ Government move to Alert Level 1 next week, the following are the expected key changes for schools at Alert Level 1:

- 1. There are no specific public health requirements.
- 2. There are no restrictions on personal movement at, so all students and staff continue to be safe to go to school and all students must attend.
- 3. We are no longer required to keep a contact tracing register but will continue with the usual practice of using VisTab (in the Office entrance) and monitoring attendance (and will need to work with local health authorities to identify close contacts, should there be a case connected with the school).
- 4. Physical distancing is not a requirement but is encouraged when you are around people you don't know.
 - 5. There are no restrictions on numbers at gatherings or on physical activities including cultural and sporting activities and other events.


