Board of Trustees - Block A Update - Project #1

Rapid progress is currently being made in the area of gib stopping and painting prep in readiness for painting, carpeting, cabinetry, toilets, electrical and the installation of autex composite wall display board. The installation of a new septic tank system for Block A is also underway.
