Reporting at Broadlands

As advised during 2020 and earlier in 2021, 2021 will be the first year where there will be no one-page formal reporting mid-year or end-of-year solely in the areas of Reading and Writing (Literacy) and Mathematics, also with the inclusion of a 'General Comment' and 'Principal Comment'.

Of course, we will be reporting to you (as we have been with Seesaw for over three years) but how this reporting looks in 2021 will be different to past years which we see as a huge advantage to us all as we continue to build our three-way learning partnerships.

Already this year there has been reporting to you through our learning sharing app, Seesaw. The most significant advantages of regular reporting through Seesaw are:

- That you receive very regular learning posts as they happen (called real-time reporting).
- The posts are tagged across all Learning Areas of the NZ Curriculum over time including: Reading and Writing (Literacy), Mathematics, Health and Physical

- Education, The Arts (music, drama, dance & visual art), Science, Social Sciences, Technology and Digital Technologies.
- The learning posts are directly linked to the NZ Curriculum 'Key Competencies' such as 'Managing Self', 'Relating to Others' and 'Participating and Contributing' AND our Virtues; particularly 'Respect', 'Responsibility' and 'Resilience'.

Another advantage is at the end of the year, your child's learning can be archived/saved for future reference.

A few weeks' ago, we offered two Seesaw Workshop opportunities during which time this information and knowledge would have been further shared and support provided in your use of Seesaw.

You are invited to discuss this further with your child's teacher or me if you wish.

Tik Tok WARNING!!

Tik Tok is a video-sharing focused social networking service owned by ByteDance. The social media platform is used to make a variety of short-form videos, from genres like dance, comedy, and education, that have a duration from fifteen seconds to three minutes.

TikTok requires that users be at least 13 years of age to use the full **TikTok** version, although there is a way for younger children to access the app. Anyone under the age of 18 must have approval of a parent or guardian.

Unfortunately, some of the grossly inappropriate Tik Tok content and language has been recently used at school. We immediately shut this down and expect that this will not continue. Tik Tok is not being accessed on any of our school devices.

As a community with young children, please be well aware of the absolute dangers of platforms, such as Tik Tok, and what your child/children may be into on-line.

Issues being discussed, such as school staffing levels, directly impact on the education of your children. While there will be some impact on the usual school programme that day, we have adjusted the programme to minimise disruption, and the school will remain open with the support of the Principal and remaining Support Staff.
