Programme

A full programme was sent out by email on **Wednesday 11 August** and can also be found in today's Bulletin below.

Uniform:

- School uniform is to be worn to and from the school as normal.
- Tamariki will wear their kapa haka uniforms during their performances which are supplied by the school. These will be changed in to/out of at Reporoa College.
- It is expected that the girls will wear their hair out during their performance so please provide the girls with a hair brush (NOT one to share).
- Boys will need to make sure they have brief black underwear to wear under their maro. NO boxers please.
- Only Maori (taonga/treasures) are to be worn.

Important details

Calves must be born on or before **10 August 2021.** This will ensure that the target weight of **100kg** is achievable by **31 October 2021.**

All bull calves must be NAIT registered with their farm and at time of sale. They will be transferred to the Broadlands NAIT number. Ross Shaw/Stephen O'Reilly will organise this.

Simon Marra from Silver Fern Farms will be handling the sale process.
