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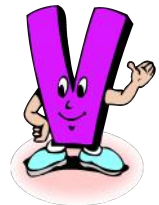

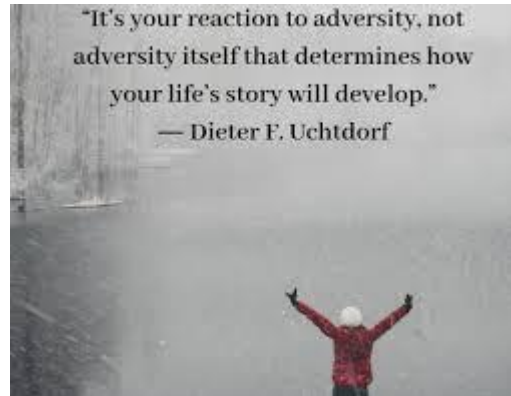

Photo Day

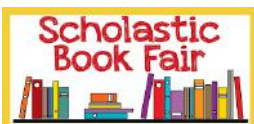
All going well for Masterpiece Photography and their Waikato Alert Level, our annual **Photo Day** will be held on **Monday 29 November**.

Each child will be encouraged to make several of the above items. All displays **MUST** be made at school rather than at home. Children are responsible for providing all flowers and equipment.

Sand for the sand saucers will be provided at school.

Parents may drop the children's flowers, etc to the Hall before 9.00am – but (because all items are being judged) the children will be expected to work on their arrangements without parent assistance.

It is appreciated that many parents encourage their children to practice their arrangements at home before the event – however, in the interests of fairness to all concerned, prepared exhibits brought to School on the day **will not** be accepted for judging.

Each child will need to bring the following materials to complete his/her exhibits to school on Friday morning and all the leftover materials and dishes taken home with them after school

Please make sure that any containers are unbreakable and named.

Equipment needed:

- **Aqua Flower** - plastic water-tight container with lid, some oasis, plasticine, large flowers.
- **Button Hole** – tin foil, fernery or greenery, a flower, pin.
- **Cut flower (one bloom)** - bottle, long stemmed flower, moss or paper.
- **Decorated Saucer** – saucer, small flowers, leaves, etc.
- **Floating Arrangement** – plastic container (e.g. pudding bowl), large flowers, leaves.
- **Miniature Arrangement** (Juniors) – smallest container possible; small flowers & foliage.
- **Miniature Garden/Park/Farm** (Seniors) – a suitable tray or other container; a lot of moss and some small plants, rocks, plastic decoration materials, etc
- **Unusual Container** – appropriate container (e.g. show, bottle, vase, etc), flowers, leaves, some oasis, etc.
- **Vegetable Creations** (i.e. creatures, vehicles or models made from vegetables) – vegetables, toothpicks, leaves, etc.

- **Floral Arrangement (Seniors)** – flat container, oasis, tall flower for centre, flowers & foliage.

(Oasis is available from local florist shops)

Bus Shelter

Rotorua Lakes Council is in the process of undertaking a stocktake of all Council-owned rural school bus shelters.

The vast majority of Council-owned rural school bus shelters are 40+ years old and many are at the end of their intended life, requiring either replacement or demolition. We need help from your school whānau to find out which shelters are (most) used and any shelters that are no longer needed. Funding for the provision of bus shelters is limited, so this information will enable us to plan a schedule for prioritising bus shelter improvements where they are most needed.

To help this process we have put together an online social pinpoint survey which shows the location of the bus shelters and gives whānau the ability to drop a pin where they think a new bus shelter is required, or a shelter needs improving. The social pinpoint also allows the community to bring to Council's attention any road safety concerns about where children wait for the bus. Concerns could be to do with visibility of children catching the bus; the speed at which vehicles travel past the school bus; or how a bus stop is positioned.

The survey will be open until 31st December 2021. However, feedback can still be given after 31st December by email, post and by phone.

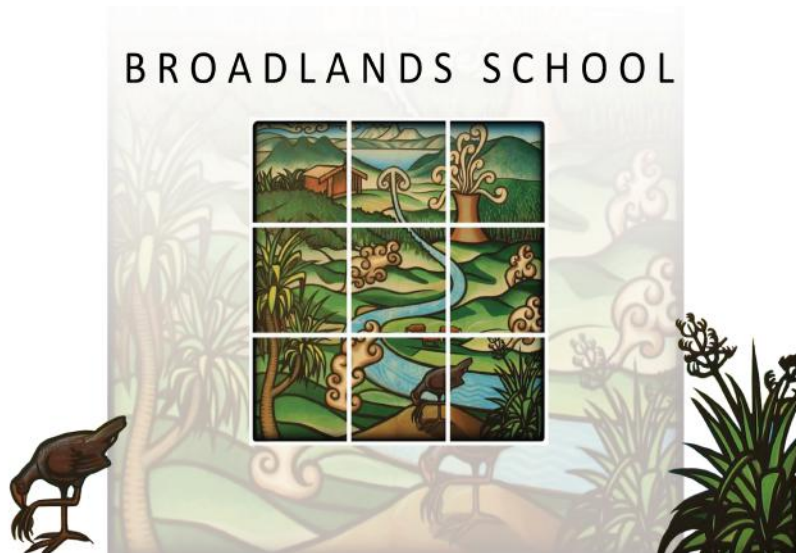

Cleaner Position
