<u> Lockdown Level 1</u> - DRILL

I would like to again reassure you that we have well-established procedures when dealing with emergency situations of which there are four main types:

Fire, Earthquake, Lockdown Level 1 and Lockdown Level 2

Lockdown Level 1 involves a scenario whereby the NZ Police advises us of a person in the immediate area whom they believe poses an undue risk to our school or local community.

At 10.00am on Wednesday 17 August (next week), we will be having a *Lockdown Level*

1 DRILL. So that we can test our communication channels and how they will operate (and to find out if there are any issues), you will receive notification via email, SchoolApp and Facebook that the **DRILL** has started.

As a special alarm sounds, all classes/teachers/Teacher Aides move to Block A where they lie low with the doors locked (from the outside), with curtains and windows closed until the all clear is given.

A reminder that the *Lockdown Level 1 DRILL* is about to start will be sent approximately *15* minutes *BEFORE*.

You will be notified when the *Lockdown Level 1 DRILL* is OVER.

Note. If you are on the school site at the time, you will be required to join in the *Lockdown Level* **1** drill.



<u>Formal Speeches, Nursery Rhymes and Poems</u>

WHAT YOU NEED TO KNOW

Calves, Lambs and Kids

These pets need to be born after the 20th July. Children are expected to present their pets to the judges in a well cared for condition. They will lead and call their pet and talk to the judges about how they have cared for them. Parents need to transport these pets to school with a lead and drinking water. Pets are tethered to the fence along side the field and children are expected to stay with their pet. Adults are not allowed with children and pets while judging is taking place, however, there will be stewards who will help your child with their pet. When your child hands in their pet day form they will be given a booklet for calves and lambs only that covers this in much more detail.

Dogs

Dogs need to have a nice nature to attend Pet Day. They are to be tethered all day under the trees by the senior playground on the field. Ghildren are expected to lead and call their dog as well as talk to the judges about how they care for them.

Domestic Pets

Your domestic pet needs to be contained in an enclosure, which will be kept in a classroom. Your child is expected to stay with their pet and talk to the judges about how they care for them. These pets need to be brought to school by parents.

Bee Creative Competition

This is a bee themed creativity competition. Ghildren can enter a creation made at home which fits into any of these three categories,

1. Edible creations e.g. cupcake creations, vegetable creations etc ...

2. Arts and crafts e.g. recyclable/reusable creations, knitted craft, fabrics etc ...

3. Digital art e.g. stop motion animation, photography, video/movies, programming etc...

Pre-schoolers

We welcome pre-schoolers to bring along a pet. There will be a special ring for calves and lambs only on the field which they can walk around with their pet. They are allowed parental help.

Pet Parade

Dress up your self and your pet any way you like. There is no theme for this. Everyone will walk in procession showing off their beautifully dressed pets. Prizes will be awarded for the best costumes.

Whanay Entertainment

Pet Day is a great day out for families, come and watch the children in the competition rings, stroll through the Bee Greative competition entries, buy raffle tickets, enjoy baking, BBQ, coffee and cold drinks in the spring sunshine.
