

Reporoa Valley Cultural Festival

Our tamariki and teachers at Broadlands School are very excited to once again be involved in the annual Reporoa Valley Cluster Schools' Cultural Festival to be held at Reporoa College Hall on **Friday 16 September**.

With Matua Grant and staff, our tamariki have been working extremely hard in preparation for this festival so we look forward to your support throughout the morning with our two school performances.

Programme

Please refer to the programme to be provided early next week for specific details.

Kohanga, early childhood, primary and intermediate groups have been allocated approximate performance group times. The organisers will endeavour to keep to the approximate scheduled group times. To avoid any disappointment, we encourage you to come along earlier.

Uniform:

- School uniform is to be worn to and from Broadlands and Reporoa College.
- Tamariki will wear their kapa haka uniforms during their performances which are supplied by the school. These will be changed in to/out of at Reporoa College. Our room base will be Mahi Tahi.
- It is expected that the girls will wear their hair out during their performance so please provide the girls with a hair brush (NOT one to share).
- Boys will require brief black underwear to wear under their maro. NO boxers please.
- Only Maori (taonga/treasures) are to be worn. **NO** jewellery.

Kai to Bring / Kai Available

There will be a BBQ (sausages/sauce/bread) and a bake stall available from 10.00am. Food and drink from the Reporoa College canteen will **not** be available. Note: there is no hangi this year (at least at this stage).

Transportation to/from Reporoa College

Transportation will be by bus, departing Broadlands at **9.00am**. If you intend taking your child home directly from the college, it is important that you let the teacher know before our two buses depart Reporoa College. Any kapa haka uniform **must** be left with your child's teacher.

The Year 1 - 3 performance group will be returning back to Broadlands School by bus at **12.30pm** so will need morning tea and a drink. Lunch will be back at school. The Year 4 - 6 performance group will also require lunch and/or money for the BBQ and return by bus at **2.00pm**.

Broadlands School Calf & Pet Day

WHAT YOU NEED TO KNOW

Calves, Lambs and Kids

These pets need to be born after the 20th July. Children are expected to present their pets to the judges in a well cared for condition. They will lead and call their pet and talk to the judges about how they have cared for them. Parents need to transport these pets to school with a lead and drinking water. Pets are tethered to the fence along side the field and children are expected to stay with their pet. Adults are not allowed with children and pets while judging is taking place, however, there will be stewards who will help your child with their pet. When your child hands in their pet day form they will be given a booklet for calves and lambs only that covers this in much more detail.

Dogs

Dogs need to have a nice nature to attend Pet Day. They are to be tethered all day under the trees by the senior playground on the field. Children are expected to lead and call their dog as well as talk to the judges about how they care for them.

Domestic Pets

Your domestic pet needs to be contained in an enclosure, which will be kept in a classroom. Your child is expected to stay with their pet and talk to the judges about how they care for them. These pets need to be brought to school by parents.

Bee Creative Competition

This is a bee themed creativity competition. Children can enter a creation made at home which fits into any of these three categories,

- 1. Edible creations e.g. cupcake creations, vegetable creations etc...
- 2. Arts and crafts e.g. recyclable/reusable creations, knitted craft, fabrics etc...
- 3. Digital art e.g. stop motion animation, photography, video/movies, programming etc...

Pre-schoolers

We welcome pre-schoolers to bring along a pet. There will be a special ring for calves and lambs only on the field which they can walk around with their pet. They are allowed parental help.

Pet Parade

Dress up your self and your pet any way you like. There is no theme for this. Everyone will walk in procession showing off their beautifully dressed pets. Prizes will be awarded for the best costumes.

Whanau Entertainment

Pet Day is a great day out for families, come and watch the children in the competition rings, stroll through the Bee Creative competition entries, buy raffle tickets, enjoy baking. BBQ, coffee and cold drinks in the spring sunshine. More information about Pet Day can be found in our Pet Day handbook which is available from the Office.
