

# Term Dates 2023

At the Board of Trustees' meeting on **Wednesday 2 November**, the following term dates for 2023 were formally approved:

- **Term 1**: Thursday 2 February Thursday 6 April (90 half-days)
- o **Term 2**: Monday 24 April Friday 30 June (96)
- o **Term 3**: Monday 17 July Friday 22 September (100)
- o **Term 4**: Monday 9 October Friday 15 December (100)

These dates meet the Ministry of Education's requirement for NZ primary schools to be open for 386 half-days of instruction.

Please diary these now for your future planning.

Prior to opening, the teaching staff begin 2023 with three Teacher Only Days including two full days on storytelling and the new Aotearoa NZ Histories Curriculum.




# Board of Trustees Brilliant News!

Also at the Board of Trustees meeting, the Board discussed and approved the decision to employ a fifth classroom teacher and open up a fifth classroom within Room 5 (our current spare room) which will be designated Year 2.

This has been made partly possible due to a steady roll growth throughout 2022 triggering an increase in our staffing entitlement for 2023 AND more importantly, the Board's decision to Board-fund a portion of this teacher's salary in order to make this possible. (I'll spare you the details as it's a little complex!).

This means we will have five classes in 2023 as follows: NE/Year 1, Year 2, Year 3, Year 4 and Year 5/6 You will be advised of your child's class for 2023 in a few weeks.

I will be advertising for this additional teacher next week.
