Specialisation at Broadlands

At Broadlands School we have a team of incredibly talented teachers and support staff. From time-to-time and on a more regular basis, we supplement our teaching and learning with a team of specialists.

During Term 1, we will be adding specialisation in the following ways:

- Digital technology / STEAM (Science, Technology, Engineering, Arts, Mathematics) classes full day / twice termly for each class with Karla
- Water Skills for Life through Water Safety NZ (Week 2)
- Making the Difference Water Safety Programme through Swim Rotorua Swimming Club - Year 3 to 6 only (Week 5)
- Creative dance classes 45 minutes / twice termly for each class with Lauren of Inclusion Dance
- Visual art classes full day / once termly for each class with artist Sally-Ann
- Life Education Trust two days / two sessions for each class (Week 2) with facilitator Leiset (focuses on life skills, friendships and relationships)

The Broadlands staff look forward to seeing you over the coming weeks, with our first school event being the annual Duathlon / Triathlon (details to follow).
