Thank you to our wonderful **PTA** for donating **\$300.00** to each class to buy in class activities. Here we have Ruma Toru with their class goodies.






On Monday, we welcomed **Mrs Debra Lynch** back from her TeachNZ sabbatical and Northern Hemisphere / European summer.

During the term, each class will prepare for, and practise, their lines, costuming, props, lighting, sound, music, movement, dance and staging as required for each uniquely different, but popular, story.
