

As part of the Ministry of Education's 'Nga iti Kahurangi - Small and Remote Schools Project', various projects will be completed at Broadlands School mid-January 2024.

These include:

- Acoustic tiling in all five classrooms
- RCD-protected wall sockets in all relevant buildings
- External LED security lighting (4 units)

During the last school holidays, insulation was installed in the ceilings above Rooms 1 to 3 / Block A as well as the removal of asbestos (as previously advised) above Room 1.

One of the challenges we face is managing numbers at each level which I have shown after each teacher's name so that you can get an understanding of this. As you can see, we have more composite (combined) classes which is unavoidable next year.

Whilst our finishing roll this year is 103, we lose 21 - Year 6's. Our starting roll will be approximately 92, which will grow through 2024.

birth of Jesus?




