




Absentee/Pick up Board - IMPORTANT!

Below is the attendance board which you will have seen, maybe used, which hangs up outside the school office.

It is important that this board be used to show if a child has travelled home or been picked up by vehicle (left-hand column) during the day, though usually at the end of the day. In particular, this helps the Bus Monitors check who is/is not travelling on the bus that day. They can also see who was absent that particular day (middle column).


Bare feet are common rather than black shoes and socks which is not always the wisest choice known to mankind! Not for me anyway!

At Broadlands School, we have well-established procedures when dealing with emergency situations of which there are four main types:

Fire, Earthquake, Lockdown Level 1 and Lockdown Level 2

Lockdown Level 1 involves a scenario whereby the NZ Police advises us of a person in the immediate area whom they believe poses an undue risk to our school community.

Lockdown Level 2 involves environmental events like a volcanic eruption, chemical spill, gas pipeline leak, fuel spill, swarm of bees or a mad cow on the loose-type scenarios which may/may not involve the NZ Police and/or Civil Defence as it depends what the situation is.

All situations can be a bit scary for some students which we truly understand, but all staff minimise or eliminate any anxiety or stress and talk to their classes with a little 'heads up'.

Important Note #1: Should a *Lockdown Level 1* or 2 occur, you will be immediately contacted through **Facebook**, **SchoolApp** and **email** when it starts and ends. Instructions will be included.

We will be holding a *Lockdown Level* 1DRILL on Tuesday 11 June at 12.15pm which is signalled by an alien-like sound


