Our tamariki, teachers and support staff at Broadlands School are very excited to once again be involved in the annual Reporoa Valley Cluster Schools' Cultural Festival to be held at the **Reporoa College Hall** on **Friday 30 August**.

With Matua Grant and staff, our tamariki have been working extremely hard in preparation for this festival so we look forward to your support throughout the morning with our three school performances, including our Te Kapa o ngā tamariki Toronga o te Kura o Broadlands (elite group).

Programme

A full programme will also be sent out on **Tuesday 13 August**.

Early childhood, primary and intermediate groups have been allocated approximate performance times. To avoid any disappointment, we encourage you to come along earlier than the approximated times provided.

Uniform:

- School uniform is to be worn to and from Broadlands School and Reporoa College.
- Tamariki will wear their kapa haka uniforms during their performances which are supplied by the school. These will be changed in to/out of at Reporoa College.
- It is expected that the girls will wear their hair half-up/half-down (if long enough) during their performances so please put up your daughter's hair in the morning at home. Please provide your daughter with a hair brush (NOT one to share).
- Boys are required to wear brief **black** underwear to wear under their maro. NO boxers or skins.
- Only Māori taonga/treasures are to be worn. **NO** other jewellery.

<u>BBQ</u>

The Reporoa Kindergarten will be providing a BBQ: 1. Saugages \$3.00 (sausage, bread, onions & sauce)

2. Meat pattie \$4.00 (meat pattie, bread, coleslaw, onions & sauce) 3. Drinks \$2.00. All will be available from morning tea. All tamariki will need to bring morning tea/lunch and a drink, although their actual lunch-time will be at school as the festival ends at 1.00pm (as per programme).

Transportation

Transportation will be by bus, departing Broadlands at **8.45am** and returning at approximately **1.00pm**.

If your child is on the Reporoa bus, they can either meet us at Reporoa College OR be dropped off at school earlier on this day by **8.30am**. We will all be returning to Broadlands School by bus at approximately **1.00pm**.

If you intend to take your child home directly from the college at the end of the festival only, it is important that you let the teacher know before the buses depart from Reporoa College.

Summer Programme 2024-25

Hi Everyone,

Please find below details of the Term 4 cricket programme for primary-aged children provided by Rotorua Cricket Association and Northern Districts. We would appreciate if you could pass this onto your sports coordinator or teacher-in-charge of sport and promote this cricket programme via school newsletters/school apps to parents etc.

SuperSmash Hub (Yrs 1-3 approx.)

- SuperSmash Cricket is an entry level, coached programme and is best suited to children 5-8 years old. It is designed to help participants learn the basics of cricket.
- This 6-week programme runs from mid-October from 3.45pm-4.45pm at Smallbone Park on Thursdays.
- Cost is \$30 for the 6-week programme.
- Mixed genders and all gear provided.
- A registration link will be sent out shortly by the Northern Districts team. For questions, please contact <u>simon@ndca.co.nz</u>.

Incrediball Cricket (Yrs 3-5 approx.)

- Incrediball is a modified game of cricket using a soft ball and plastic gear. It is suited for children who
 understand the basics of cricket or have reasonably developed hand-eye coordination.
- Teams: 6 kids per team (so the kids get more ball time than previous years), all games are mixed gender.
- <u>Games</u>: are played on Thursday afternoons, at Smallbone Park, Devon Street. These run from 3.45pm until 5.00pm (approx.), from 24th October until 12th December 2024.
- Fees: \$10 per player for Term 4.
- <u>Coaches</u>: Rotorua Cricket will supply coaches for Incrediball teams (I know, cool right!). 1-2 parents per team are also required to support with organisation and mustering kids. Plus, it's a great game to watch, so come along and enjoy. For those parents keen on cricket, *we encourage you to give coaching a go*. Our coaches will act as mentors, supporting you to develop coaching skills for future years.
- <u>Gear</u>: all equipment is provided.
- <u>Registrations</u>: Schools can register whole teams (or individuals) via email to <u>info@rotoruacricket.co.nz</u>. We can create combined teams where full teams are not possible. Registrations are due (ideally) by end of Term 3.

Harrow Hardball Cricket (Yrs 4-6 approx.) - NOW THURSDAY AFTERNOONS

- Hardball cricket is played using wooden bats and protective gear (helmets, gloves, batting pads etc), as
 well as a hard cricket ball. It is suited for children who have already played Incrediball Cricket or who
 have well-developed hand-eye coordination.
- <u>Teams</u>: are made up of 8 kids per team, all games are mixed genders.
- Games: will be played on <u>Thursday afternoons</u> from 24th October through until 12th December 2024.
 - Matches are held in Rotorua starting at 3.45pm at various grounds around Rotorua (Boord Park, Neil Hunt, Puarenga etc).
 - You may play one game in Tokoroa, depending on the draw.
- Training: Nets are available for training, please book these through info@rotoruacricket.co.nz.
- Fees: The cost for hardball cricket is \$35 per player for Term 4, we will form new teams for Term 1 after the holidays.
- <u>Coaches</u>: Teams are required to have a coach and a parent who can score / umpire. We have a coaching
 development programme for parents or volunteers who haven't coached before, so give it a go. We
 may be able to support teams who struggle to find a coach, please enquire.
- <u>Gear</u>: Schools are encouraged to provide their own gear, however if you do not have any/enough equipment, please contact <u>info@rotoruacricket.co.nz</u> to discuss options as we have some team gear we can lend to schools.
- <u>Registrations</u>: Schools can register whole teams (or individuals) via email to <u>info@rotoruacricket.co.nz</u>. We may be able to create combined teams where full teams are not possible. Registrations are due (ideally) by end of Term 3.
