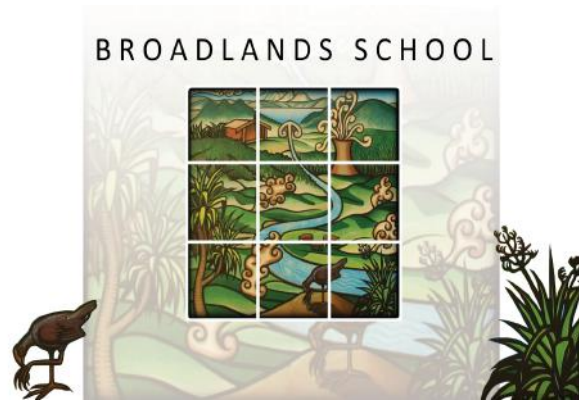

WHAT YOU NEED TO KNOW

Calves, Lambs and Kids
These pets need to be born after the 20th July. Children are expected to present their pets to the judges in a well cared for condition. They will lead and call their pet and talk to the judges about how they have Cared for them. Parents need to transport these pets to school with a lead and drinking water. Pets are tethered to the fence along side the field and children are expected to stay with their pet. Adults are not allowed with children and pets while judging is taking place, however, there will be stewards who will help your child with their pet. When your child hands in their pet day form they will be given a booklet for calves and lambs only that covers this in much more detail. This year due to TB restriction we have consulted with local vets and will be taking precautions by keeping all calves separate to minimise any risk.

Dogs
Dogs need to have a nice nature to attend Pet Day. They are to be tethered all day under the trees by the senior playground on the field. Children are expected to lead and call their dog as well as talk to the judges about how they care for them.

Domestic Pets
Your domestic pet needs to be contained in an enclosure, which will be kept in a classroom. Your child is expected to stay with their pet and talk to the judges about how they care for them. These pets need to be brought to school by parents.

Get Creative Competition
This is a Animal themed creativity competition. Children can enter a creation made at home which fits into any of these three categories.
Edible creations e.g. cupcake creations, vegetable creations etc.
Arts and crafts e.g. Recycled creations, knitted craft, fabrics etc.
Digital art e.g. stop motion animation, photography, video/movies, programming etc.

Preschoolers
We welcome pre-schoolers to bring along a pet. There will be a special ring for calves and lambs only on the field which they can walk around with their pet. They are allowed parental help.

Pet Parade
Dress up your self and your pet any way you like. There is no theme for this. Everyone will walk in procession showing off their beautifully dressed pets. Prizes will be awarded for the best costumes.

Whanau Entertainment
Pet Day is a great day out for families, come and watch the children in the competition rings, stroll through the creative entries, buy raffle tickets, enjoy baking BBQ, coffee and cold drinks in the spring sunshine. Strike Action - Thursday 23 October 2025 - Week 3



The 23 October strike keeps on growing

'It's going to be big and it's coming up fast. Only one week to go until more than 40,000 NZEI Te Riu Roa members walk off the job for a historic one-day strike next Thursday, 23 October.

Primary and area school teachers, primary principals, support staff, kaiārahi i te reo, therapists and Ministry of Education specialist staff are all on strike from 7am to 7pm.

And we are far from alone. More and more workers across the motu keep joining the strike. Doctors, dentists, nurses and other public sector workers who feel the same way as we do – unvalued and unrecognised by the Government – have joined us. And firefighters will be out in support too.

The upshot? There will be 100,000 of us telling the Government it needs to invest in the basics, like education, health and emergency services.

We're not backing down from our tasks, and we're not going anywhere.'

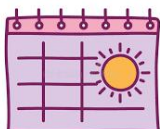
Bus Vests



Over these holidays, please ensure your child has their BUS VEST in their bag ready to go for next term. *This is to keep them seen and safe.*

For those students travelling on a Ritchies bus service, a bus vest **MUST** be worn **TO** and **FROM** school. Please have a routine and expectation sorted at home to ensure students have their vests every day at school.

You may notice some of our students now are wearing a **blue vest** - these are our fantastic **bus monitors** who help to carry out bus duties each day.



Term Dates 2026

The Board of Trustees has approved the following Term Dates for 2026.

- Term 1: Monday 2 February - Thursday 2 April (84 half-days)
- Term 2: Monday 20 April - Friday 3 July (106)
- Term 3: Monday 20 July - Friday 25 September (100)
- Term 4: Monday 12 October - Tuesday 15 December (92)

Note that these dates meet the Ministry of Education's requirement for schools to open for instruction for **382** half-days per year. They exclude Public Holidays.

For 2026, the Ministry of Education has also approved an additional two Teacher Only Days for schools to engage in professional learning around the implementation of the new curriculum. You will be advised well in advance when these are. (see official statement below)

Issue 200: Ministry Bulletin 02.09.25.

The Government has approved four curriculum half-days each year in 2026 and 2027 to support staff with planning and professional learning for curriculum and assessment changes. You will not need to make up these half-days, they are officially approved under the Education Regulations: 8(5) and 9(1).

School Communication - Changes to bus rolls

- If your child is being picked up by another family adult, we **MUST** have your consent..

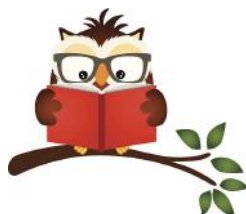

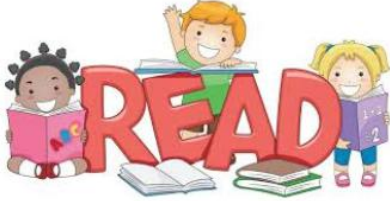
This ensures sufficient time to get messages out to students before this very busy time of the day and helps to ensure the bus leaves Broadlands School on time for connecting buses.



Reading at home

Reading to your child, or your child reading to you everyday will make a big difference!

Reading together helps to promote the development of early literacy skills including:



- Knowledge of the alphabet
 - Turning pages
- Pointing/sweeping of the finger
- Text orientation (left to right)
- Developing word knowledge/vocabulary
- Recognising punctuation and grammatical features
- Phonological awareness- the sounds that letters and letter blends make
 - Improving comprehension
 - Building independence
 - Creating social awareness
- Developing perceptions and emotions in life.



The quantity and quality of your shared reading experience will impact greatly on your child's reading success!

Children who are readers find other learning easier!

Karla is currently studying counselling through the University of Waikato and is halfway through her Master's in Counselling (Narrative Therapy). These kōrero are part of her learning journey and offer a gentle, confidential space for tamariki or whānau to talk about what's going on.



Variety funding for families

Variety has received \$50,000 of funding for tamariki and rangatahi living in Rotorua.

More information about how caregivers in your community can apply for this funding, is below. Families will need their valid Community Services Card.

Variety - the Children's Charity has received \$50,000 of funding for tamariki and rangatahi in Rotorua!

Our Individual Grants (IG) programme provides one-off funding for something your child needs. The good news is, your child doesn't have to be part of the Kiwi Kid Sponsorship programme to be eligible for an Individual Grant.

An Individual Grant pays for a one-off need such as...

- Everyday essentials (such as clothing, car seats and shoes)
- School costs (including uniforms, stationery, activity fees, school camps, and school trips)
- Digital devices for school (for children aged 8 or older)
- Extra-curricular activities (like sports lessons, music lessons, club fees, and uniforms)
- Medical fees (covering doctor's fees, prescriptions, glasses, medical, and mobility costs)
- Beds and bedding (beds, cots, bedding packs)

You can apply for an Individual Grant if you have a **valid Community Services Card** and your **child is aged between 0-18**.
